Under Ms. Northup's leadership, the Center's game-changing litigation work has transformed how reproductive rights are understood by courts, governments, and human rights bodies. Ms. Northup will reflect on the current state of reproductive rights 45 years after Roe v. Wade, the impact of the new administration, and the vital role lawyers and bar associations play in safeguarding the constitutional protections for bodily autonomy and reproductive decision making.

Ms. Northup is President and CEO of the Center for Reproductive Rights, a global human rights organization whose game changing litigation and advocacy work – combined with its unparalleled expertise in the use of constitutional, international, and comparative human rights law – have transformed how reproductive rights are understood by courts, governments, and human rights bodies. Headquartered in New York City, the Center has offices in D.C., Geneva, Bogota, Katmandu, and Nairobi. She was the founding director of the Democracy Program at the Brennan Center for Justice, served as a prosecutor in the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York, and clerked on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit.

Ms. Northup has held adjunct appointments at NYU Law School and Columbia Law School, and taught courses in constitutional and human rights law. She graduated from Brown University and Columbia Law School.

A frequent public speaker, Ms. Northup is quoted widely in the national press including the New York Times, USA Today, and the Washington Post, and has appeared on ABC World News Tonight, CBS Evening News, NBC Nightly News, FOX News, PBS, MSNBC, and NPR.
